



## Candle

### Safety Information Leaflet

This leaflet contains safety information if you are planning to ignite your Hert felt candle

Keep this leaflet in a safe place for future reference

Remember this leaflet is designed to provide guidance. However, if you have any doubts about your ability to manage a lit Hert felt candle, DO NOT IGNITE

A Hert felt candle can be a great decorative object too. But injury or damage caused to people, animals or objects are not worth the risk

#### Before Use

Remove candle from packaging and place the packaging away from candle

Ensure the candle is at least 10CM away from other candles

Ensure the candle is away from flammable items

Ensure the candle is placed on a flat surface

Do not remove candle from glass container

Trim wick to about 1 cm before lighting

#### During Use

Do not leave unattended

Keep away from children and animals

Do not use candle to heat other objects

Do not place candle in draft

If you start to feel tired, extinguish the candle

Do not allow the candle to burn for more than 4 hours

Do not move or handle the candle while burning

### **After Use**

Always snuff out the candle. Do not blow out

Ensure the wick is not smouldering after being extinguished

### **Accident**

The information in this leaflet should help reduce risk of accident

However if one does occur, this section can provide some general guidance. However this information should not be regarded as authoritative. Professional advice should be sought

### **Fire**

Only tackle a fire if you are confident and will not put you or others at risk

Otherwise leave the building and call the Fire Brigade on 999

### **Burns and Scalds**
